To protect your privacy, you will only be identified to researchers with a unique numeric code that the system will asign, not by your name. This form should only be used by participants. Researchers will have their accounts created for them automatically.

Privacy Principles

The "Resonal Information Protection and Electronic Document Act" hosporates the two principles of the Cavadian Standards Association (CSH 'Model Code for the Protection of Personal Information." The Privacy Principle stability free innimum standards required to be followed by organizations for the protection of personal information. This site has adopted and incorporated these Privacy Principle into its Privacy Code. The 10 Privacy Principles are as followed:

1. Accountability This site is responsible for information under its control and shall designate an individual(s) who isfare) accountable for the organization's compliance with the Privacy Principles.

2. Identifying Purposes This site shall identify the purpose for which personal information is collected at or before the time the information is collected.

3. Consent The knowledge and consent of the individual are required for the collection, use or disclosure of personal information outside of the course of research, except where inappropriate.

4. Limiting Collection
The collection of personal information shall be limited to that which is necessary for the purpose identified by the organization.

5. Limiting Use, Disclosure and Retention Personal Information shall note used or disclosed for purposes other than those for which it was collected, except with the consent of the individual or as required by law, and shall be retained only as ing an excessing of Willimers of those purposes.

6. Accuracy Personal information shall be accurate, complete and as up-to-date as is necessary for the purpose for which it is to be used

7. Safeguards Security safeguards appropriate to the sensitivity of the information shall protect personal information.

8. Openness The organization shall make specific information about its policies and practices relating to the management of personal information readily available.

9. Individual Access Upon request, an individual shall be informed of the existence, use and disclosure of his or her personal information and shall be given access to that information. An individual shall be able to challenge the accuracy and completeness of the information and have it amended as appropriate.

10. Challenging Compliance

Step 2: Click on the studies with *Timeslots Available*. Each activity lists how many points it is worth.

Clicking on the title of a talk or study will give you more information about it: whether it's online or in person, what languages might be involved, what tasks / topic are covered, etc.

Note: The very first study you should participate in is the one called "Language Background Questionnaire." You are required to participate in this (and earn credit for it) before participating in most other studies. (You can attend talks without doing the questionnaire.)

Step 4: Once you've attended the talk and written your summary, click on "View study website."

This summary is due within ONE week of attending the event.
